## **Background to the Congress**



The FIATA World Congress is the annual event for Senior Level Executives from across the Global Freight, Logistics, Transport and Distribution Industries.

### What is FIATA?

FIATA is the "International Federation of Freight Forwarders Associations" and was founded in Vienna/Austria on May 31, 1926. A non-governmental organisation, FIATA now represents an industry covering approximately 40,000 Forwarding and Logistics firms, also known as the "Architects of Transport", employing around 10 million people in 160 countries.

FIATA has consultative status with the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) of the United Nations (inter alia ECE, ESCAP, ESCWA), the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD), and the UN Commission on International Trade Law (UNCITRAL). It is recognised as representing the freight forwarding industry by many other governmental organisations, governmental authorities, private international organisations in the field of transport such as the International Chamber of Commerce (ICC), the International Air Transport Association (IATA), the International Union of Railways (UIC), the International Road Transport Union (IRU), the World Customs Organization (WCO), the World Trade Organization (WTO), etc. In summary FIATA is the largest non-governmental organisation in the field of transportation. Its influence is worldwide.

There were 16 Founding Members of FIATA, a global group of National Association Bodies for their Countries Freight and Customs Brokerage industries. Today, FIATA lists over 100 National Association Members amongst its wider Membership. As 2016 was the 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of FIATA, this event was incorporated into the 2016 Dublin Congress.

### What is the FIATA World Congress?

Each year FIATA hosts an **International Congress**, bringing together high level Speakers addressing the future of the global freight industry and allowing its member significant networking opportunities. FIATA National Association members bid for the opportunity to host this prestigious event and a successful host Country is selected by FIATA's Congress Committee and Extended Board three years in advance. Ireland put together a strong bid in 2013 and was announced as a finalist alongside Qatar and South Africa in June of that year. Two Delegates from Ireland, Seamus Kavanagh and Paddy Kenny, travelled to the 2013 FWC in Singapore and successfully promoted Ireland as the destination for 2016.

## **Organising of the Congress**



### Organising the Congress

A Professional Congress Organiser has to be employed and consequently Conference Partners were appointed. A Local Organising Committee (LOC) of 13 were enlisted. Working with Conference Partners, responsibility within the LOC was divvied into categories, including Sponsorship & Exhibition, Congress Programme, Relationship with FIATA Boards, Marketing and Social Programme/ Catering.

The Congress Budget came to above half a million euro.

### Congress Programme

The successful approach to a good Congress depends largely on high quality Speakers with some sessions requiring at least 3 Speakers, a total of 38 International Speakers were involved. In accordance with the FIATA Protocol for organising World Congresses the Programme had to be agreed with FIATA 12 months in advance. The Dublin Congress was the commencement of a process of change in the FIATA Congress Programme. This was prompted by IIFA. For example, the format for the Young Professionals Forum one day before the Congress has been adopted by the Organisers of the 2017 Congress in Kuala Lumpur. Over 60 Speakers were considered and invited before finally settling on the number of 38.

Given FIATA's relationship with influential interest groups worldwide, expectations for quality Speakers were high. The Secretary General of the World Customs Organisation, Dr. Kunio Mikuriya was invited to speak during the Opening Ceremony alongside the FIATA President, Mr. Zhao Huxiang, Chairman of Sinotrans, one of the largest Logistics companies in China and John Bruton, former Taoiseach, gave the Keynote Address.

This quality/ level of Speakers was the highest in recent FWC history. International Speakers were sourced at Harvard University, the International Chamber of Commerce, the European Commission, the International Road Transport Union, leading Global Air Cargo Carriers and more.

### Venue and Social Programme

IIFA's impulse to bid for the Congress originated in 2013, the year in which the Gathering was heavily promoted. IIFA Council viewed bidding for the Congress as the Association's best method to support this initiative. As such, the goal from the beginning was to have a showcase event, to attract International Delegates to visit Ireland.

The venue chosen was the Convention Centre Dublin, regarded by the Director General of FIATA as "probably the best Convention Centre that I have seen anywhere in the World and I have seen quite a few." Running alongside the Congress Programme, a good Social Programme is essential for the evening entertainment of particularly accompanying Delegates/ Partners and more importantly informal networking.

The Dining Hall of Trinity College Dublin held the Congress Welcome Reception on the first day, followed by a Night of Irish Culture in Ballsbridge Hotel on day 2 and a Gala Dinner in the CCD on the final day. Many Delegates also took the opportunity to tour Ireland in advance of the Congress. Pre-Congress tours to Titanic Belfast and a Golf Tournament in the K Club were arranged for these Delegates. The K Club Tournament was a resounding success with 96 participating Delegates.

## **Promotion and Marketing**

While the FIATA World Congress is a Global event, the Congress had spent its recent years outside of Europe; Taipei 2015, Singapore 2013, Los Angeles 2012, Cairo 2011. The last Congresses in Europe were Geneva in 2009 and Istanbul in 2014. Furthermore, while Ireland is an attractive location, Dublin does not hold the new business attractiveness of larger European hubs such as Rotterdam, Antwerp and Hamburg. Even with a doubled roster of quality Speakers and attractive social functions, IIFA needed to travel to events around the Globe in promotion of the Congress.

IIFA exhibited the Dublin Congress at the 2015 FIATA World Congress in Taipei, the 2016 Transport Intermediaries Association Annual Conference in San Antonio, Texas and sought sponsor partners through the 2015 and 2016 Multi-Modal UK shows and 2014 FWC in Istanbul, Turkey. Furthermore, IIFA Representatives made presentations on the Congress during FIATA's 2014 – 2016 HQ Sessions in Zurich, Switzerland, at a number of events across the UK in partnership with BIFA (British Freight Association) and at the Latin American Freight Congress in Barcelona in June 2016. At home, IIFA exhibited the Congresses at various industry exhibitions and through partnering with fellow industry bodies such as Irish Exporters Association at their events nationwide. 








## Social Media for the 2016 FIATA World Congress Dublin



### **Final Overview**

While the FIATA World Congress was an event organised by IIFA for the Irish Freight Industry, this was an opportunity to showcase Ireland to our Global Industry colleagues. The business of Freight Forwarding operates and prospers through international relationships and IIFA was proud to win the opportunity to host this prestigious Congress for Dublin and share Irish culture with Representatives from 75 different countries. Countless hours were poured into promoting the Congress, in seeking Sponsorship, in attracting Key Speakers and all of the intricacies involved with planning such a large event.

The FIATA World Congress was the largest Global gathering of the Freight, Logistics and Transport industries in 2016. 2017 will see the FIATA World Congress take place in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, India for 2018 and South Africa for 2019. While the Congress may return to Europe in 2020, this event will not be held in Dublin for the foreseeable future. Given the work put into the Congress by the IIFA Local Organising Committee, the 2016 Congress is one that will be remembered as one of the highlights of FIATA 90<sup>th</sup> year history as it moves forward to 100 years representing the Global Freight Industry.
